# Changing Rooms – Appeal 2002

## Newsletter No 3- summer 2003

This is the third Newsletter detailing progress in the acquisition of funding for financing the demolition and reconstruction of the changing rooms. Our aim is to raise  $\pounds 100,000$  locally by the late summer of 2004 with construction, hopefully, commencing soon after that.

## **Principal Funding**

A representative from the FA Football Foundation - Grass Roots scheme visited NPLSC recently to assess our plans for the new Changing Rooms and estimate the likelihood of us being given a grant. The good news is that our proposed development plans for the Club should be acceptable and we have an excellent chance of receiving a 50% (maybe even more?) grant towards construction; the **bad news** is that we have to redesign the building to conform to standards changing modern of room accommodation with an estimated cost of more than £200,000! Pat McLoughlin, our architect, is beavering-away and hopes to complete the redesign by the end of August. We now have a **Business Plan** in draft form for final submission to the Football Foundation in September.

## **Local Fund Raising**

- The raffle at the *NPL Summer Ball* was very successful with twelve members and friends collecting £1834.
- A *Football Dinner* honouring *Peter Osgood* (former Chelsea FC star) raised about £400.
- Robert and Berty Clayton collected £173 at a *private party* mainly for tennis section members.
- The latest emptying of the *Bar Jar* realised £222.
- The *"200 Club"* now has about 90 members, but this is far short of the target and more are urged to join. The top prize-winners so far are Elisabeth Nicol and Nan Williams. The next draw is on **Summer Carnival** night.

A donation of £3 a month for one share (maximum two) enters members in a monthly draw for maximum cash prizes of £25, £50 and £100, with a special bonus draw of £250 every 3 months. Entry forms are available from *Tony Grimmer* and *Steve Fidler* or other bar staff enabling subscribers to commit up to £6 per month on a regular basis. With a full membership this scheme could raise over £4000 in a year.


