Stanton Trophy 2014 5 km Run

The final event of the 2013/14 Stanton Trophy, the hotly-contested 5 km run, was held on Wednesday 7 May.

Following a day of occasional heavy showers, including a quick sprinkling at 5.30 pm, 41 runners gathered at the Pavilion for a 6.00 pm start. Pre-race chat focused on how the strong headwinds would affect the times, and whether the smaller field would hinder those who appreciate a pacemaker. Race organiser Barry Scott gave a stirring speech, along with a warning that petting of the deer in Bushy Park had been firmly forbidden by The Royal Parks, and they were off.

The first runner home was **Ross Williams of TQEEM**, in a time of 17 minutes 56 seconds (missing out on equalling Lloyd Ryan's course record by 6 seconds), followed by his team-mate Joseph Thom with a time of 18 minutes and 22 seconds, and Stanton veteran Crispin Allen of Mat/Ac with a time of 18 minutes and 37 seconds. The first three ladies to finish were Harriet Caruana of N/Ads in 23 minutes and 5 seconds, Natalie McClelland of Mat/Ac in 23 minutes and 9 seconds, and Elly Martin of Mat/Ac in 23 minutes and 56 seconds.
